We help to ensure that women are treated fairly, their health and safety needs are met, and they’re set up for success after their time in the system by providing them with individual civil legal assistance.

**We know that it’s vital to make sure that every Oregonian is treated equally under the law and that all of our due process rights are protected.** That’s why our Immigrant Rights Project provides personalized legal advice to public defense providers about the immigration consequences of pleas and convictions for their non-citizen clients.
